



Ten-Point Program to Support Our Students and Communities

Protect Our Students and Communities

- 1. We want to protect our students and communities from the uncertainty of a new federal administration that seeks to privatize our schools and disrupt our students' right to a high-quality public education.
- 2. We want to preserve federal funding for vulnerable students (11% of San Diego Unified's budget) that includes Title I funding for low-income students, Title III funding for immigrant and multilingual students, and IDEA funding for students with disabilities.
- 3. **We want welcoming schools** where all families can safely bring their children to learn, regardless of immigration status.

Safe and Nurturing Schools

- 4. We want equal treatment for all students, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression.
- 5. **We want expanded restorative justice practices** to address the growing social, emotional and behavioral needs of our students.
- 6. **We want to defend our academic freedom** to teach the truth with a community-based and culturally-responsive curriculum that prepares our students to be critical thinkers and changemakers.
- 7. We want clean school facilities that allow students to focus on their learning in healthy and safe environments.

Stability for Our School Communities

- 8. **We want to end destabilizing layoffs and transfers** during the school year that change students' teachers and interrupt critical connections with families.
- 9. **We want to improve access to affordable housing** and other resources beyond the school day for our students and their families.
- 10. **We want more community schools** that provide ongoing services and support to fit each neighborhood's needs, run by the people who know our children best families, educators, staff and the students themselves all working together.
