KNOW YOUR RIGHTS! Salary Advancement

Our contract gives members the right to additional pay for additional work! There are a variety of stipends and hourly rates in the contract for taking on assignments beyond their contracted duties and beyond their work day, attending conferences, and more. Make sure to review Appendices A through G in your contract to see the current contracted rates and stipends for your specific role!

National Board Certification can

earn credits for salary advancement (See 2.030 in Appendix A & 2.027 in Appendix B) and can exempt you from other evaluations during the certification process (14.2.11.)



FREE PROFESSIONAL LEARNING THAT ADVANCES YOUR SALARY:

- As CTA members, SDEA members can get FREE university credits through Chico State for attending both virtual and in-person trainings.
- Virtual trainings include watching recorded trainings using the CTA Virtual Pass.
 This means you can advance your salary by watching videos that are relevant to your work!



KNOW YOUR RIGHTS! Salary Advancement

Salary Scale 101: Your pay increases each year you work at the District and also increases if you earn university credits or degrees. SDEA members fought hard to win the right to advance on the salary scale even without getting a Master's degree, so earning enough university credits can advance you to the next column on the salary scale even if you don't earn an additional degree beyond the required BA. This gives members more flexibility to be compensated for their professional learning, as long as credits are **relevant for their current assignment.** Make sure to review section 2.02 in Appendix A about what course work is creditable!



Note for credit completion: If you recently completed credits and have not gotten your salary advancements yet, reach out to HR. It appears that transcripts from some universities sometimes don't have enough identifying information to differentiate between SDEA members with similar names.
